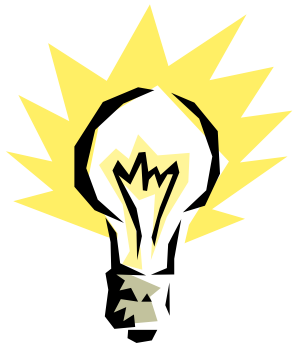

SUMMER MOWING

We will be mowing every week this summer, please pick up all yard articles, decorations, hoses, and close your umbrellas when not in use. The mowers require 5' of clearance to mow.

In the RV section, management does the mowing and trimming, but we do not take care of flower beds. Please make sure they are free of weeds.



Here We go Again...

As we face another hurricane season, please take time to make up a hurricane survival package for each member of your household, including your pet. Make sure you have enough food, water, medicine and any other personal items for at least three days minimum.

If part of your plan is to go to a shelter, call around and see which shelters allow pets and what type of accommodations are available. At some shelters, you may need to bring your own bedding and other items such as toilet paper. Invest in an air mattress if you can and a portable radio with weather channels and plenty of batteries.

Once you have decided on a plan, let a close friend or relative know. Also please make sure that the community office is aware of your plan and that they have on file your up-to-date emergency information names and numbers.

Above all, keep safe and hope for a storm free summer.
